Wednesday March 14 at 6:30 pm - Rick Smith and his lecture on The Molly Maguires.

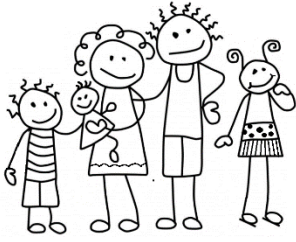

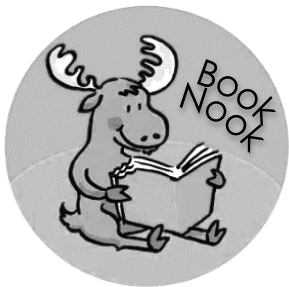
Saturday Matinee at the Western Pocono Community Library
